

"Sec. 7. And be it enacted, That all persons having heretofore obtained a license from this State to use and carry on any of the several branches of business in this act mentioned, which license shall not have expired, may continue said business under said unexpired license till the expiration thereof, after which expiration and not before, they and all of them shall become subject to the provisions of this bill. And all persons heretofore required to purchase of the State a license to exercise or carry on any branch of business or pursuit, for which no provision is made in this law, nor any new rate of charge for such license fixed herein, shall be and remain subject to the rates and provisions of previous laws on those subjects, applicable to them or to the business or occupation they severally and respectively pursue."

Amendment assented to.

Mr. Hall offered the following amendment:

"Section 8. And be it enacted, That no applicant for a traders' license, shall be permitted, under such license, to sell any spirituous or fermented liquors, unless he shall take out an ordinary license of twenty five dollars."
