The rules were suspended to allow him to report a bill entitled an act amendatory of an act entitled, an act to incorporate the village of Bladensburg in Prince George's county passed at January session 1854, chapter 137;

Archer for legal services rendered the State, by the appointment of the Governor, in the prosecution of Robert Swift for the murder of Jeremiah Kilhour, with an amendment.

Mr. Partridge chairman of the Committee on Judiciary reported favorably on a bill entitled, an act to provide for the appointment of a keeper of the records of the Court of Chancery.

And reported unfavorably on a bill entitled, an act to prescribe the fees to be charged and received by the constables in the several counties of this State and the city of Baltimore;
