REPORT.

The undersigned, constituting a minority of the committee upon Internal Improvements, to whom was referred the subject of the charter to incorporate the Baltimore and Green Spring Avenue Company, beg leave respectfully to report:

That they have given the subject a full, fair, and candid investigation, and are of opinion that the prayer of the Memorialists ought to be granted, some of the reasons for which conclusion, they herewith submit.

The Memorialists in their petition alledge, that their comfort and convenience would be promoted by the construction of this road, because there is no public highway communicating with their farms and residences, and accessible to them. That they are willing to construct a good McAdamized road passing through this district of country out of their own means, provided the Legislature will give them an act of incorporation.
