MILLINGTON, February 27th, 1856.

*To the Honorable, the Legislature of Maryland.*

Gentlemen:—In compliance with an act of a former Legislature we, the trustees of the Millington Academy, report to your Honorable Body, that our Institution is in successful operation under the care and management of John V. Crosby, Esq., (a classical scholar.)

The average number of pupils is about forty.

They are engaged in all the various studies common to a school of the kind, from the A. B. C. scholar to the higher branches of Mathematics, and the Latin and Greek languages.

We also have instructed the requisite number of poor children as required by law.

Mr. Bowie from the select committee reported favorably on a Senate bill entitled, an act to appropriate a sum of money to pay
