proposing a Joint Committee to consider, during the recess of of the Legislature, the report of the Commissioners appointed to codify the laws of this State.

We concur in your proposition, and have appointed, on the part this House Messrs. to join the gentlemen named by your Honorable body to constitute such Committee.
