Whereas, Frederick W. Jones, the Reporter and Correspondent of the Baltimore Republican newspaper, has caused to be published certain disrespectful and offensive remarks upon a member of this House, in violation of the courtesies extended to him of a seat on this floor,

Ordered, That the said Frederick W. Jones be and he is hereby deprived and prohibited from further privilege and use of a seat on this floor;

Which was adopted.
