

It is now given, as far as it is practicable, in the reply to the next question.

3rd. The Principal of the College received from the beginning of the period mentioned, up to the 1st October last, a salary of..... \$2000 per annum.

The Professor of Mathematics..... 1000 “

[The Professor of Modern Languages, a part of time \$500, at another time, when additional duties were imposed, \$1000.]

The Principal of the Grammar School..... 700 “

At the recent re-organization, the compensation of the Professors was changed. The Principal now receives a salary of \$1500, and charged house-rent \$300 per annum. The Vice Principal's salary is \$1000, and charged house-rent \$150. The salary of the Professor of Ancient Languages, is \$800, house-rent \$150. The Professor of Mathematics and Modern Languages \$800 each. Professor of the Preparatory Department \$600. The compensation heretofore allowed the Secretary, has been entirely withdrawn. The tuition money, after deducting \$1200 for current expenses, is divided equally among the members of the Faculty.

The residue of the resources have been expended in carrying on the Institution, in repairs, improvements of the buildings, furniture for the recitation rooms, apparatus, fuel, and other necessary expenses. The vouchers for all payments and disbursements are filed and preserved. The Treasurer, Mr. James Mackubin, of Annapolis, will be prepared to give any detailed and minute information in respect to the disbursements and state of the College funds which may be required.

The Trustees appropriated a sum of \$250 for a festival on commencement day, 1852, in conformity to a usage which prevails at all the other Colleges of which we have any knowledge. This is the only occasion when any part of the funds have been expended for such or any kindred purpose.

4th. The only part of the public buildings not used for strictly educational purposes, besides the commons and the rooms occupied by the Principal and his family, is a room in the basement of the main building, which has been fitted up and used as a depository for the Standard Weights and Measures of the State.

The only portion of the College grounds leased or rented for agricultural purposes, is a lot which heretofore has been cultivated by the Steward, for the uses of the Commons. Some arrange-
