A bill reported to authorise William T. G. Polk, administrator of Arnold Cottman, free negro, to execute a deed of manumission for certain slaves therein mentioned, 203.

A bill reported to amend and explain an act relating to free negroes in Kent, Cecil and Queen Anne's counties, passed December session, 1849, chapter 538, 208; bill amended, 255-'6; bill passed 310; passed by the Senate with amendments, 552; amendments assented to and bill passed, 553.

A bill from the Senate to empower William Washington Carlile and Gustavus Carlile, free negroes residing in Harford county, to navigate their vessel or vessels as masters thereof, to and from the city of Baltimore and the head waters of the Bush and Gunpowder rivers, 358; bill rejected, 445-'6.

A bill reported for the relief of Daniel Myers, Levin Wheatley and Edward J. Wheatley, free negroes of the city of Baltimore, 382.

A bill reported relating to slaves and free negroes in Kent county, 430; bill passed and sent to the Senate, 730.

A bill reported for the relief of Susan Smallwood, a free negro woman of the District of Columbia, 431; bill passed and sent to the Senate, 490, 491; returned passed by the Senate, 793.

A bill reported for the relief of Sophia Conway, a free negro of Baltimore county, 433.

A bill from the Senate to authorise the commissioners of Harford county to sell or manumit certain negro slaves belonging to said county, 128; referred, *ib.*; favorable report on, 137; bill passed, 440, '1.

Leave to bring in a bill to allow Charlotte A. Wheat, a free colored woman, to remain in the State, 450; bill reported, 458; bill passed and sent to the Senate, 835, 836.

Leave to bring in a bill entitled an additional supplement to the act of 1831, chapter 323, entitled an act relating to free negroes, 450; bill reported, 524.
