And the Message was adopted.

Mr. Kidd offered the following order:

Ordered, That the committee on Education immediately upon their appointment, inquire into the expediency of introducing a bill to establish a system of Common Schools for the State, and report to this House at the earliest practicable day.

Which was read and adopted.

The Doorkeeper, Postmaster and Pages to the House, appeared and were duly qualified by the Speaker.

On motion of Mr. Magruder, Mr. Dolla 88/ Masid of

Leave was granted the committee on the Judiciary, hereafter to be appointed, to introduce a bill to grant the leave of the Legislature to a sale of land to the Vestry of Saint Paul's Parish in Calvert county.

On motion of Mr. Schnebly,

Leave was granted the committee on Corporations, hereafter to be appointed, to introduce a bill entitled, an act relating to the Banks of this State.

The Secretary of the Senate delivered the following Message.
