Spencer, a free negro of Frederick county, to dispose of his real and personal estate by last will and testament, 374; bill passed and sent to the Senate, 695.

A bill reported entitled an act to permit Minerva Barnes, a free woman of color, of Allegany county, to remain in the State, and to relieve her from all penalties incurred by her removal into the State, 374; bill passed and sent to the Senate, 695, 696.

A bill reported entitled an act for the benefit of Ebenezer Horner, William Hammond, Ennalls Dickinsbn, Hewett Ross, William Philips, Israel Collins and Stephen Philips, free persons of color of Caroline county, 400.

A bill reported entitled an act for the benefit of Henry Byas, a free negro of color of Caroline county, 400; bill passed and sent to the Senate, 823.

A bill reported for the benefit of Daniel Gibson, a free man of color of Caroline county, 400; bill passed and sent to the Senate, 745.

A bill reported for the benefit of James Wheeler, a free person of color of Caroline county, 400; bill amended, passed and sent to the Senate, 745, 746.

Petition from C. A. Simmons and thirty-one other citizens of Frederick county, praying the passage of an act prohibiting free negroes from holding schools, referred, 406.

Petition from sundry white persons, of Baltimore, to repeal the act that prohibits colored persons from holding religious meetings in certain cases, referred, 407.
