

PENSIONS—

Petition of Mrs. Ellen Shank, widow of John Shank, a revolutionary soldier, for a pension, referred, 79; bill reported, 148; bill passed, 149; passed by the Senate, 517.

Petition of Mrs. Easter Williams, widow of Henry Williams, a revolutionary soldier, for a pension, referred, 79; bill reported, 149; passed and sent to the Senate, 149, returned passed, 518.

Petition from William J. Emory, of Queen Ann's county, asking for the payment of money due his mother, a Revolutionary pensioner, referred, 104.

Petition of Mrs. Catharine S. McKim, of the city of Baltimore, praying to be allowed a pension for the services of her husband, in the war of the Revolution, referred, 105; leave to bring in a bill, 148; bill reported 148; bill passed, and sent to the Senate, 182, passed by the Senate, 538, 539.

Order adopted, granting leave to withdraw from the files of the House, the memorial of Grace Bewley, widow of George Bewley, a Revolutionary soldier, for relief therein mentioned, 105.

Leave to bring in a bill to correct an error in the act of Assembly, passed at January session, 1856, chapter 77, and to pay Joseph Benson, one year's additional, of which he was deprived by said error, 148.

Petition of Louisa Gassaway, of the city of Annapolis, praying to be allowed a pension, &c., referred, 169.

Petition from the children and heirs at law of Mrs. Barbara Riley, widow of the late Major Riley, praying for the pension due their mother, referred, 184.

Leave to bring in a bill, directing the Comptroller to pay Louisa Gassaway, the residue of the pension due to her mother, at the time of her death, 187; bill reported 202; bill passed, and sent to the Senate, 225; returned, passed by the Senate with amendments, 375, bill passed as amended, 375.
