Ordered, That so much of the Governor's Message as refers to the "lawlessness in Baltimore," be referred to a committee to be composed of one delegate from each county and the city of Baltimore, and that the Chairman of said committee shall, on the application of any three members, summon such witnesses and send for such papers as they may deem necessary, to a full and fair investigation of the subject.
