this House, at the earliest day possible, a succinct statement of the financial condition of the State, to be prepared by him, with the view of exhibiting the farthest extent to which the various State taxes, now levied may be respectively abolished or reduced, without endangering the ability of the State regularly to meet its liabilities;

Which was adopted.
