Mr. Mackubin presented a petition of Louisa Gassaway of the city of Annapolis, praying to be allowed a pension, &c.;

Mr. Stirling presented a petition of 246 ladies of the 18th Ward of Baltimore city, praying the passage of a prohibitory liquor law;

Which was referred to the committee on Judiciary.

Mr. Stirling presented a petition of 98 ladies of the 15th Ward of Baltimore city, praying the passage of a prohibitory liquor law;

Which was referred to the committee on Judiciary.
