duce a bill to secure to Sarah Gamill, the title to a certain House and Lot, in the town of Havre de Grace, in Harford county.

On motion of Mr. Burgess,

Leave was granted to the Charles county delegation, to introduce a bill for the relief the sureties of Benjamin Marshall former collector of State and County taxes in Charles county.

On motion of Mr. Belt,

Leave was granted to the Prince George's county delegation to introduce a bill to supply defects in the system of public roads in Prince George's county.

On motion of Mr. Stirling,

Leave was granted to the committee on Judiciary, to introduce a bill to provide for and regulate the registration of births, marriages and deaths in this State

Mr. Magruder, from a majority of the committee on Judiciary, reported unfavorably on a bill entitled, an act to interpret and define the meaning of the word "resident" as used in Art. 1, section 1, of the Constitution of Maryland.

Mr. Alexander, from the minority of said committee, reported favorably on said bill;

Which was read the first time.
