On motion of Mr. Duvall,

Leave was granted to the committee on Claims to introduce a bill to appropriate a sum of money to pay the account of James G. Henning, clerk of the Circuit Court of Montgomery county ;

On motion of Mr. Landing,

Leave was granted to the Worcester county delegation, to introduce a bill to prohibit the traffic in carriages from other States, without first obtaining a license therefor as other peddlers do, so far as the same relates to Worcester county ;

On motion of Mr. Alexander,

Leave was granted to the committee on Internal Improvements, to introduce a bill to amend an act entitled, an act to promote internal improvements, by the construction of a Railroad from Baltimore to the city of Washington ;

On motion of Mr. Kilbourn,

Leave was granted to the committee on Judiciary, to bring in a bill to enlarge the powers of the various courts in this State having Equity Jurisdiction, in relation to the enforcement of the vendor's lien on real estate ;

On motion of Mr. Moore, of Somerset,

Leave was granted to the Somerset county delegation, to introduce a bill for the making of better roads in Somerset county, by the appointment of road Commissioners in the several districts in Somerset county by the Commissioners of said county ;
