

Sec. 1, in line 6, strike out all after the word "provided," and insert "that nothing therein contained shall be construed to prejudice the rights of any purchaser for valuable consideration, without notice or any bona fide judgment, creditor or mortgagee, without notice, where interest or rights may have accrued since the execution and acknowledgment of the said deed, and provided that the said deed be recorded within two months from the passage of the act;"

Which were assented to.

The said bill as amended, was then read the second time.

The bill entitled, an act to refund to Walter P. Snow, administrator of Edward D. Martin, late clerk of the Circuit Court for Worcester county, and to Geo. B. Gray, late Register of Wills for the same county, certain sums of money erroneously paid into the Treasury;
