Mr. Stirling, from the committee on Judiciary, reported favorably on a bill entitled, an act to empower administrators de bonis non, to recover for devastavit committed by an executor or administrator.

Mr. Thruston, from the committee on Judiciary, reported favorably on a bill entitled, an act to protect the proprietors of mineral lands in Allegany county,
