Section 1. Be it enacted, That from and after the passage of this act, it shall not be lawful for any person, or persons, to act as the agent or agents, within this State, for any individual, or association of individuals, or corporations not incorporated and authorised by the laws of this State, to make insurance or marine or fire risks, on insurance on lives, or to make other insurances, or to receive or transmit offers for insurance to their principals, or to receive or deliver policies of insurance, or any instruments in the nature or to the effect of policies of insurance, or to advertise or offer to make such insurances, or to receive and transmit such offers, or to receive or deliver such policies, by publication in any newspaper, or by any card or circular, or to open any office for the transaction of such business, although such individual or individuals, or
