Ordered, That the committee on Education be instructed to inquire into the expediency of establishing by State appropriation, a uniform system of Agricultural Education in the Public Schools of this State, and to report by bill or otherwise;

Which was adopted.

Mr. Kilgour offered the following order:

Ordered, That the committee Federal Relations, be instructed to open a correspondence with the Governors of the adjoining States on the expediency of establishing a uniform system of banking;

Mr. Ford, of Cecil, moved to lay said order on the table;

Which was determined in the affirmative.

Mr. Grieves offered the following order:

Ordered, That George W. Hughes report to this House, as soon as practicable what progress he has made in the matter of settling and determining the true boundary line between the States of Maryland and Virginia;

Which was adopted.

Mr. Magruder offered the following order:

Ordered, That the State Lamplighter, appointed by the Speaker of this House, be and he is hereby allowed the sum of three dollars per day; and shall perform such other duties as the Speaker may direct;
