

Insert the words "or free negroes," after the word "slave," in the twenty-first line, 16th section.

Strike out the words "at fines and penalties," in the first and second lines of the 18th section.

Insert the word "and," after the word "fines," in the first line of same section.

Insert after the word "ordinances," in the fifth line of section 13th the following words: "and recover the same in the name of said corporation, before any justice of the peace of said county, as other fines and forfeitures are now recovered;"
