Talbott, Benjamin Dyer and Charles H. Bowen, agents for the collection of taxes in arrears in the city of Baltimore, due the State of Maryland;

Mr. Spence, from a select committee, reported favorably on a bill entitled, an act to provide for the increase of the per diem allowance of the Commissioners of Worcester county;
