Mr. Lynch, of Baltimore city, presented the petition of Mr. Fuller, asking compensation for clerical services rendered the State of Maryland, in the collection of Taxes in arrears;

Which was referred to the Committee on Claims.

The unfinished business of yesterday being in order, the House took up for consideration the resolution offered by Mr. Lynch, of Baltimore county, authorising the Adjutant General to grant the use of forty muskets for the use of St. Timothy's Hall;

Mr. Lynch, moved to amend by striking out, "40" and inserting "25;"

Which was determined in the affirmative.
