February 26th, 1858.

We have received your message of the 25th instant, proposing to refer the work reported by Messrs. Scott and McCullough, Commissioners appointed under the 17th section, article 3d, of the Constitution, to revise and codify the Laws of this State to a joint committee of the two houses, with power to set during the recess, and report the same to the next session of the General Assembly, and concur therein, and have appointed on the part of this House, Messrs.
