Mr. Dail, proposed the following amendments:

In line four, after the word "forty," insert "three."

In line seven, after the word "State," insert "to Alexander B. Hagner the sum of forty-seven dollars and seventy-two cents, for costs paid by him in the case of John Cochran, and of A. B. Hagner vs. the State.

To Joseph J. Steuart the sum of thirty-seven dollars for services as chief clerk at a former session of the House of Delegate.

To John T. Wright, the sum of six dollars, for washing eight dozen towles for the Senate Camber.

To Lewis Goutee, the sum of twenty dollars and sixty cents, for repairing furniture in the Hall of the House of Delegates.
