The bill entitled, an act to provide for the division of the city of Baltimore into twenty wards, and of said wards into election districts;

Being upon its second reading,

Mr. Alexander proposed the following amendments:

"Strike out all after the enacting clause, and insert:

"That the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore shall have authority, at any time, and from time to time, in their discretion, to re-divide the several wards of said city, so as to make the number of voters in each ward as nearly as practicable; said wards not to exceed twenty in number; Provided that said divisions shall not in any manner disturb the present Congressional Districts, or such Congressional Districts as shall hereafter be laid off;"

Mr. Belt proposed the following amendment to said amendment:

"Provided that it shall be the duty of the Mayor and City Council to exercise the powers granted by this act within the period of six months from its passage;"

Which was not assented to.
