This day to the fourteenth day of November in the year of Our Lord
Seventeen hundred thirty eight was return that he hath beene
ready looked by whom the aforesaid process was commanded
and now holden afterwards to wit the day and year last mentioned
Came again the said Lord Prop. by his Attorney and the said
Henry in his proper person comon also and the Jurors of that
Inry being impannelled and called thereto came to wit Matt'l
Hudson, Richd' Wilson, Bouj' Blackstock, Thom' Halderon,
Hans Hanson Junr, Will'm. Gourly, Tho: Bordley, Galliard
Rutkett, John Reed, John Clark, Thomas Sanders, John Raven
who being duly elected by the aforesaid Jury
the aforesaid Henry Smith appearing to the Verdict of the Jurors
and upon their Oath do say that Henry Smith is guilty as
he standeth Indicted and by Matt'l Hudson their foreman all
to say we Therefore it is considered by the Justices here to
wit at Great County Court at the Court house in the Town of Chester
in said County on the third Monday of November being the fourteenth
day of said month in the year of Our Lord seventeen hundred thirty
and eight that the said Henry Smith shall stand in and upon
the Pillory in the County and for the space of One hour And
shall be whipt at the publick whipping post in the same
County with fifteen lashes upon the bare Back often thousand
Pounds and his blood to appear And it is commanded to the
Sheriff of Great County that he do the Execution herof upon him
the said Henry immediately after his arraignment And it is further
considered that the said Henry do pay unto Wm. Carrickdale
Master of two hundred fifty pounds of tobacco being the four fold of
the value of his goods as so as aforesaid Stolen and that the said Henry
do return to the said William the said good or his single value
therof being Sixty two pounds of tobacco And he not having
wherewithall to pay the four fold aforesaid Thereupon
he is committed into the custody of the Sheriff of Great County until his
four fold aforesaid be satisfied It is also considered by the Justices at
the time and place aforesaid that the said Henry pay the sum of one
hundred severall pounds of tobacco costs remaining on the
process and to the Officers of this Court as ordered by the
Court here that the aforesaid Henry give security for the fees and charges
incurred on the process and to the Officers of this Court And he
having no One to Offer nor no One offering for him therefore
