and prayeth that his recognizance taken as aforesaid may be discharged

prayed — Hugh Morris his recognizance taken
as aforesaid by this Court here Discharged there being no cause
shown to the contrary

It is Ordered by this Court here that the aforesaid David Crane
enter into recognizance for his appearance and good Behaviour
during Court setting (Especially towards Mary Wood)
Thereupon David Crane of Chester Town Carpenter and
present herein before Court Acknowledgeth himself to be
indebted unto his Lordship the Vice Progry of this Province to be
paid and recovered on his body goods and chattels Lands & tenements
for the use of his said Lordship his heirs & Successors With
Condition to this recognizance that the aforesaid David Crane
makes his personal Appearance before the Justices of this
present Court during the setting of the same Court Then and
there to answer unto such things as shall be Objected against him
