At which said third Tuesday of June being the day of years aforesaid cometh Hugh Morris here into Court in his proper person and prayeth that his recognizance taken as aforesaid may be discharged as prayed. Ordered by this Court here that the sd Hugh Morris his recognizance taken as aforesaid be discharged as prayed. Hugh Morris his recognizance taken as aforesaid is by this Court here discharged there being no cause shown to the contrary.

It is Ordered by this Court here that the sd David Brand enter into recognizance for his appearance and good Behaviour during Court sitting (Especially towards Mary Wood) Thereupon David Brand of Chester Town Carpenter and proved herein the sd County Court acknowledgeth himself to be putted into his Lordship the Kings property of this Province to be made and seized on his body goods and chattels lands & tenements for the Use of his said Lordship his heirs & Successors with Condition to this recognizance that the sd David Brand makes his personal appearance before the Justice of this present Court during the sitting of the said Court then and then to answer unto such things as shall be objected against him.
