 Law

 which they return the following Verdict

Kent County vs The Jurors for the right honourable  
 the said Property that now is for the body of Kent County  
 upon their Oath do present that John Rodgers late of  
 Kent County Plunder on the first day of June Anno Domini  
 produced hundred thirty six with force and Arms at the  
 County of in and upon a certain William Graves in the presence  
 of God and the said Lord Property then and there being an Oath  
 did make and that in the said William Graves did then  
 there beat wound and cruelly beat and other harms to him then  
 and there did to the great Damage of him the said William  
 Graves and against the peace of the said Lord Property his  
 God rule and Government
