

His Lordship & the Bench it remembred that on
James Stewart & the day of Ann
Domin 1739 personally

appeared before us and the Lordship Justice of
the Peace for Kent County James Stewart Patrick
Burn and Acknowledged themselves Indebted to his
Lordship the Lord Prop^r of the Province of Maryland
in the sum of twenty pounds current money of this
Province to be made and levied on their body goods
and chattels Lands and Tenements for the use of
his said Lordship his heirs and Successors With
Condition to this Recognizance that James Stewart
as witness his personal appearance before the
Justice of Our next August Court to be held for the
County of St. John and there to answer unto such
things as shall be Objected against him on his
Lordship's behalf and in the mean time to keep the
Peace and be of good behaviour (Especially towards
Ann Gallaway) Then this Recognizance to be
void and to remain in full force in Law

upon their Oath do Present that James Stewart late
of Kent County Plaintiff on the first day of August Anno
Domini Seventeen hundred and thirty nine with force and
Arms at the County as in and upon a certain Patrick Burn
in the peace of God and the said Lord Prop^r then and
there being an Assault did make and him the said
Patrick Burn did then and there beat wound and sorely
beat and other harms to him then and there did to the
great Damage of him the said Patrick Burn
and against the peace of the Lord Prop^r his good
rule and Government &c — George
