that is to say Benjamin Ayres in the sum of forty pounds
current money of the province of Md. and Corobabel French
William Burk in the sum of Ten pounds like money each
to be made and levied on their body goods and Chattels Lands
and Tenements for the use of his said Lordship his heirs and
Successors with Condition to this Recognizance that if the said
said Benjamin do make his private Appearance before
the Justice of our next County Court to be held at our Court
House in the Town of Chester in said County on the third
Tuesday of June next to testify in behalf of his Lordship
against the sd John Rawson on Suspicion of Felony, then
this Recognizance to be void the to Remain in full force in
Law
