 London or to their assigns they paying freight for
 the Goods at the Rate of Five pounds per Ann
 wth Maryland duties wth Primage & Awarage accustomed
 In witness whereof the Master or purser of the
 said Ship hath affirmed to these Bills of Lading at
 of this date the one of which Bills
 being Accompted the other parts stand void
 And so God send the Ship to her desired port in Safety
