 and appurtenances therunto belonging Royall mines Excepted
 for Ever, Against him the said William Sweatnam his Heires
 for himselfe and his Heires Further Covenant, grant and Agree
 And to and with Every of them by these Presents yf all whole
 now have or ought to have together with all the Patents, Papers,
 for Ever hereafter shall be fully wholly and Intirely Vested
 to his and their only Proper use and behoofe forever without
 name his Heires Lindeall or Colatorall, or by his or their means
 Whomever to have, hold use and Enjoye free and Clear from
 somsoever by him the said William Sweatnam heretofore made
