(Senate Bill 433)

~~AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 9 (e) and (f) of Article 33 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1957 Edition), title "Elections", sub-title "Supervisors of Elections and Employees", requiring election judges to attend a school of instruction before taking office and to receive compensation for such instruction.~~

AN ACT TO ADD NEW SECTION 9 (K) TO ARTICLE 33 OF THE ANNOTATED CODE OF MARYLAND (1957 EDITION), TITLE "ELECTIONS", SUB-TITLE "SUPERVISORS OF ELECTIONS AND EMPLOYEES", TO FOLLOW IMMEDIATELY AFTER SECTION 9 (J) THEREOF, TO REQUIRE ELECTION JUDGES IN ALLEGANY COUNTY TO RECEIVE COURSES OF INSTRUCTION IN THEIR DUTIES, AND PROVIDING COMPENSATION AND EXPENSES WHILE TAKING SUCH COURSES.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Sections 9 (e) and (f) of Article 33 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1957 Edition), title "Elections", sub-title "Supervisors of Elections and Employees", be and they are hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

THAT NEW SECTION 9 (K) BE AND IT IS HEREBY ADDED TO ARTICLE 33 OF THE ANNOTATED CODE OF MARYLAND (1957 EDITION), TITLE "ELECTIONS", SUB-TITLE "SUPERVISORS OF ELECTIONS AND EMPLOYEES", TO FOLLOW IMMEDIATELY AFTER SECTION 9 (J) THEREOF, AND TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

(e) *Following their appointment and following a course of instruction in their duties administered by the board of supervisors, all such judges shall appear at the office of the board of supervisors of elections in the county or in Baltimore City, as the case may be. Each such person shall take and subscribe to the oath prescribed in Article I, Section 6 of the Constitution of Maryland. Said oath shall be taken and subscribed to before one of the members of the board of supervisors, and commissions shall thereupon be issued to such judges. In the discretion of the board of supervisors in any county, such oath may be taken and subscribed to upon forms to be supplied by said board before any officer authorized by law to administer oaths; and upon receipt of any such form, duly executed, the board shall issue a commission therefor.
