AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 256 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Wicomico County (1959 Edition, being Article 23 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland), title "Wicomico County," subtitle "Revenue and Taxes," subheading "Tax Exemptions" to amend the exemption from taxation for County purposes of land, buildings, mechanical tools and implements used by manufacturers in Wicomico County, and to provide for agreements for payments in lieu of taxes.

This particular Bill is a local Wicomico County Bill, and pertains to the same subject matter as House Bill No. 192, which was also vetoed by me on this date.

By letter dated April 10th the Attorney General advises me that in the opinion of his office, this Bill does not meet the requirements of the Constitution. It is because of this opinion that the Bill is being vetoed.
