

tion 284G thereof, providing for the administration of scholarships in education by the State Scholarship Board, for the determination of financial need as a prerequisite to the receipt of scholarships in education, establishing allowable annual quotas of scholarships and overall maximum numbers of scholarships for each county and each legislative district of the City of Baltimore under the program of scholarships in education and under the General State Scholarship Program, in order to reflect increases or decreases in the membership of the two houses of the General Assembly which have been or may be occasioned by reapportionment thereof, providing for the filling of vacancies under the General State Scholarship Program, the program of scholarships in education and the Senatorial Scholarship Program, providing for the transfer of appointments to senatorial scholarships and providing generally for a program of scholarships in education and a General State Scholarship Program under the administration of the State Scholarship Board.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Sections 284 and 284G (e) of Article 77 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1957 Edition and 1962 Supplement), title "Public Education", sub-titles respectively "Chapter 27. Free Scholarships" and "Chapter 27A. State Scholarship Board", be and they are hereby repealed; that Sections 284C and 284G (c) of the said Article and sub-titles respectively of the Code (1962 Supplement), be and they are hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments; that new Section 284H be and it is hereby added to the said Article of the Code (1962 Supplement), sub-title "Chapter 27A. State Scholarship Board", to follow immediately after Section 284G thereof, and all to read as follows:

284C. A member of the General Assembly or other appointing authority entitled to award a scholarship or designate the recipient of a scholarship appointment, under any of the provisions of this sub-title or elsewhere in this article, shall make such award or designation, on or before July 1 of each year, or by agreement with another member of the General Assembly or other appointing authority may transfer such right of appointment to such other member or other appointing authority who shall exercise such appointment right by said date; and the appointing member or authority shall notify the recipient of the scholarship appointment and the educational institution concerned of such appointment by said date. If such scholarship appointee shall not be accepted for admission because of a failure to meet the academic or admission standards of such educational institution, or shall withdraw from enrollment in such educational institution, or shall be dropped or dismissed from enrollment therein for academic reasons or for failure to observe the rules and regulations of such educational institution, or a vacancy in a scholarship occurs for any reason, on or after July 1, the educational institution concerned shall promptly notify the appointing member or authority with respect thereto and such appointing member or authority shall be entitled to appoint another qualified applicant for the scholarship within thirty (30) days after receipt of such notice from such educational institution [ , for the remainder of the scholarship term awarded to the previous scholarship appointee].
