

any wild bird or wild animal because of an emergency situation or condition, said Game and Inland Fish Commission shall have the authority to extend the period aforementioned beyond the days specified below so as to provide a comparable number of days in any given season for the hunting, taking, capturing, killing, possession, sale, purchase, shipment, transportation, carriage or export of any wild bird or wild animal. The seasons for wild ducks, geese, brant, rail-birds, woodcock, doves and jacksnipe shall be set annually and published each year in order that they may, in the discretion of the Commission, conform to the federal migratory bird regulations adopted annually by the Secretary of the Interior.

Kind of Game	Open Season
Squirrel and wild turkey	October 5 to November 30, inclusive. Provided further, that a landowner residing on his farmlands, or a tenant, of said farmlands, may kill any squirrel if said squirrel is destroying corn on said farmlands between August 15 and October 1, inclusive. And in Baltimore City, where squirrels are damaging personal property the owner or tenant of said property may kill said squirrel or squirrels at any time.
Partridges (quail)	November 15 to February 15, inclusive.
Male English Ringneck, Mongolian or melanistic mutant pheasant or any other imported species, ruffed grouse, rabbit, or hare	November 15 to January 5, inclusive. It shall be unlawful to hunt any upland game in any manner in Garrett and Allegany counties during the open season for the hunting of deer.
<i>Bear</i>	<i>During regular male deer season only, if prescribed by the Commission.</i>
Male deer, with two or more points to one antler, provided male deer with an antler three or more inches long, with the points measuring from the top of the skull as the deer is in life [ , bear, antlerless deer. ]	[May be hunted, pursued, or killed for a period of nine days beginning the first Thursday in December, except on the Woodmont Rod and Gun Club in Washington County, December 15 to December 24, inclusive, provided, that in counties having a bow and arrow season, deer of either sex can be killed between September 1 and December 31, by means of a bow and arrow. Antlerless deer may be hunted, pursued or killed by special permit, at any time in such counties or portions of counties as established by regulation of the Game and Inland Fish Commission except that no such period for hunting antlerless deer shall be authorized in Carroll, Frederick, Washington and Garrett counties except that in the Hancock elec-
