Senate Bill No. 11—By Senator Malkus:

A Bill entitled: An Act to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 211 of Article 89B of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1963 Supplement), title "State Roads", sub-title "Bonds, Notes or Other Evidence of Indebtedness", sub-heading "State Highway Construction Bonds, Second Issue", amending the laws concerning the powers of the State Roads Commission to borrow for the use of the several counties in order to remove from said law special provisions concerning Dorchester County.

Senate Bill No. 12—By Senator G. R. Hughes:

A Bill entitled: An Act to add new Section 233A to Article 77 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1957 Edition), title "Public Education", subtitle "School Attendance", to follow immediately after Section 233 thereof, authorizing the excusing of pupils from attendance at schools for purposes of moral and religious instruction.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Rules.

Senate Bill No. 13—By Senator James:

A Bill entitled: An Act to repeal Chapter 380 of the Acts of 1963 and to repeal Sections 159-166A, inclusive, of Article 33 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1957 Edition and 1963 Supplement), title "Elections", subtitle "House of Representatives", and to enact in lieu thereof new Sections 159-166A, inclusive, to stand in the place of the sections so repealed, revising the several congressional districts in this State for the election of representatives in the Congress of the United States, creating a new Eighth Congressional District, making special provision for the filing of certificates of candidacy for the primary election in the year 1964 for the office of representative in the Congress of the United States, and relating generally to the boundaries of the several Congressional Districts in this State and to the election of representatives to fill these offices.

Senate Bill No. 14—By Senator Dorf:

A Bill entitled: An Act to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 37(x) of Article 87 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1963 Supplement), title "Sheriffs", sub-title "Compensation and Duties", providing for a mileage allowance for the Sheriff's office of Baltimore City.
