

Amendment No. 6—In lines 38 through 42, inclusive, of Section 118 (c) on page 4 of the third reading file bill, strike out beginning with the words “and a” in line 38 down to and including the word “shown” in line 42; and in lines 47, 48 and 49, strike out beginning with the numerals “\$50.00” in line 47 down to and including the word “Court” in line 49, and insert in lieu thereof the following: “Ten Dollars (\$10.00) nor more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00)”.

Which amendment was read and adopted.

Amendment No. 7—In line 34 of Section 120 on page 4 of the third reading file bill, strike out the numerals “\$500.00” and insert in lieu thereof the following: “100.00”.

Which amendment was read and adopted.

Amendment No. 8—In lines 21, 22 and 23 of Section 120 on page 4 of the third reading file bill, strike out beginning with the words “and also” in line 21, down to and including the word “habitation” in line 23, and insert in lieu thereof a comma.

Which amendment was read and adopted.
