Senate Bill No. 3—State Tax Rate

AN ACT providing for the rate of State taxation for the year Nineteen Hundred and Sixty-five (1965) necessary to pay the installments of principal and interest falling due in such year on the Armory Loan of 1948 (Chapter 4, Extraordinary Session of 1948), the General Construction Loan of 1949 (Chapter 277, Acts of 1949), the General Public School Assistance Loan of 1949 (Chapter 502, Acts of 1949), and the Maryland School for Blind Loan of 1949 (Chapter 6, Acts of 1949, Special Session).
