

House Bill No. 16—By the Anne Arundel County Delegation:

AN ACT to authorize an extension, for the calendar year 1964 only, of the time within which the County Commissioners of Anne Arundel County are required by law to adopt the county budget, fix the general and special tax rates in the county, and to impose the county tax levy for the ensuing fiscal year.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Rules.

House Bill No. 17—By Delegate Palmisano:

AN ACT to add a new Article 11A to the Annotated Code of Maryland (1957 Edition) to follow immediately after Article 11 thereof, and to be under the new title "Lottery Commission" establishing a commission to be appointed by the Governor for the purpose of administering a State-operated lottery in order to provide funds to be distributed to Baltimore City and the counties of Maryland for educational purposes, defining the functions, duties and powers of said commission.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Rules.

INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTION**House Resolution No. 1—By the Washington County Delegation:**

House Resolution expressing deepest sympathy upon the death of Honorable John B. Huyett, of Washington County.

Since the last meeting of the General Assembly in Special Session in March of this year, the Honorable John B. Huyett, member of this body from Washington County, passed away on September 26, 1964.

Delegate Huyett was born on January 14, 1889 at Wilson. He was educated in the Washington County public schools and was engaged in business in the county for many years until his retirement.

A veteran of the United States Army in World War I, he was a member of the American Legion and the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

He was affectionately known in Washington County as "Mr. Democrat" because of his years of service to the Democratic party as an elected and appointed official. From 1934 until 1939, he was a member of the Board of Liquor License Commissioners. In 1942, he was elected to a term as Sheriff of the County. In 1946, he began serving the first of three consecutive terms to which he was elected as a member of this body from Washington County, serving until 1958. In 1958 and 1959, he was chairman of the Democratic State Central Committee for the County and from 1959 until 1962 he was vice-chairman of the Central Committee. In 1962, Mr. Huyett was re-elected to the House for his fourth term.

He was the uncle of another former member of this body, Charles B. Huyett, who now serves as the City Treasurer of Hagerstown.
