

easily create friction with administrative authorities in these states. No justification for such a result has been brought to my attention. The existence of this possibility alone constitutes a serious threat to the efficient conduct of racing in Maryland because of the practical necessity of close cooperation between regulatory authorities concerned with racing in contiguous geographical areas.

For the above reasons, and because House Bill No. 170 represents an undesirable and disruptive approach to the orderly regulation of racing in Maryland, I was compelled to veto this Bill.

House Bill No. 8—Sunday Sales in Anne Arundel County
