On motion of Mr. Nicols,

Ordered, That the commissioners appointed by the act of December session 1838, chapter 323, entitled, an act in aid of the construction of a State Armory and Town Hall, in the city of Baltimore, and the rebuilding and improvement of the Hanover Market House in said city, report to this House, at an early day, the amount of money realized under the various drawings of the the lottery authorised by said act, and to what purpose the said money has been applied, or in whose hands it now is.

Ordered further, That the chief clerk be instructed to forward a copy of the foregoing order to said commissioners.

On motion of Mr. Boteler,

Leave was granted to the committee on Lotteries to bring in a bill to provide for the more speedy completion of the consolidated lotteries, and the augmentation of the State revenue from this source.

On motion of Mr. Randall,

Leave was granted to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to bring in a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to prevent gaming, passed at December session 1826, chapter 88.

Mr. Buskirk, from the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to which were referred the petitions of Thomas Heyden and Thomas Lloyd, of Pennsylvania, praying for the passage of a law entitled, an act for the benefit of the Roman Catholic Church at Harman's Bottom, Somerset county, Pennsylvania.

And of Lebre Howard and Hiram Howard, praying for an act to authorize the Court of Appeals of the Western Shore to hear at the present term, a case depending between the petitioners and the Philadelphia, Wilmington and Baltimore Rail Road company.

And of Elizabeth M. Leech, praying to make valid a will therein mentioned, reported unfavorably thereon;

Read the first time and laid on the table.

Also, from the same committee, to which were referred to bill entitled, an act to make penal the wanton disinterment of dead human bodies.
