

On motion of Mr. Sherwood of Talbot,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Sherwood of Talbot, Bowdle and Colston, to bring in a bill to change the time of electing trustees in primary schools in Talbot county.

On motion of Mr. Buskirk,

Leave was granted to the committee on Internal improvement, to bring in a bill to alter and amend the law prescribing the mode of electing the agents to represent the State in all joint stock companies in which the State is interested.

Mr. Gallagher, chairman of the committee on Corporations, reported a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Deptford Fire Company of the city of Baltimore.

A bill entitled, an act to incorporate the German Beneficial society of the Trinity Church of the city of Baltimore.

And a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Barkellsville Union Band of Frederick county;

Mr. Boteler, from the committee on Lotteries, reported a bill entitled, an act for the more speedy completion of the Consolidated Lotteries, and the augmentation of the State revenue from this source.

Mr. Sutton, from the select committee, to which was referred the bill from the Senate entitled, an act to make valid a certain deed of mortgage therein mentioned, reported the same without amendment.

Read the second time by special order.
