appeals from the judgments of single magistrates and the district courts, to the several county courts of this State;

Which were severally read the second time, passed and sent to

the Senate.

The House then took up the following resolutions, also entitled to a second reading.

The resolution in favor of Elizabeth Frazier, the widow of Levin Frazier, an officer in the war of the Revolution;

Read the second time.

On motion of Mr. Randall,

The following amendment to the said resolution was read and assented to:

"Also, pay to the said Elizabeth Frazier, or order, the arrears of pension due to her said husband at the time of his death, under the resolution passed at December session 1819."

The said resolution as amended was then assented to and sent

to the Senate.

The House then took up the preamble and order submitted by Mr. Key on Friday last, in relation to the distribution of the money in the Treasury liable for the payment of the interest on the public debt amongst the public creditors.

Mr. Key then with the unanimous consent of the House, with-

drew the said resolution.

On motion of Mr. Buskirk,

The House took up the reports of the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, on the memorial of Thomas Heyden and of Thomas Lloyd of Pennsylvania, praying for the passage of a law entitled, an act for the benefit of the Roman Catholic Church at Harman's Bottom, Somerset county, Pennsylvania.

Also, on the petition of Lebre Howard and Hiram Howard, for an act to authorise the Court of Appeals of the Western Shore, to hear at the present term, a case depending between the petitioners and the Philadelphia, Wilmington and Baltimore Rail Road Com-

pany;

And on the petition of Elizabeth M. Leech, praying to make valid a will;

Severally read the second time and concurred in.

On motion of Mr. Buskirk,

The House took up the bill from the Senate entitled, an act for the benefit of George R. Kuhn, a minor of Hamilton county in the State of Ohio;

Read the second time by special order, rejected and returned to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Morsell,

Leave was granted to the committee on Colored Population, to bring in a bill to permit George W. Weems of Calvert county, to introduce certain negroes into this State from the State of Louisiana.
