Ordered, That so much of the message of the Executive as refers to the Judiciary, be referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, hereafter to be appointed.

Ordered, That so much of the message of the Executive as refers to the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company, be referred to the committee on Internal Improvements, hereafter to be appointed.

Ordered, That so much of the message of the Executive as relates to the case of Frederick Fritz alias Jacob Brucker, be referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, hereafter to be appointed.

Mr. Murray, from the select committee on that subject, reported a bill entitled an act to allow further time to Benjamin T. Pındle, sheriff elect of Anne Arundel county, to execute his bond for the year 1843;

Read the first and by special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Roberts,

Ordered, That the chief clerk be authorised to furnish the members of this House, for the present session, with such newspapers as they may direct, the expense whereof, for each member not to exceed the price of one daily newspaper.

On motion of Mr. Buskirk,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Buskirk, Pickell, Neff and Buchanan, to bring in a bill for the relief of Margaret McKinley, of Alleghany county.

On motion of Mr. Buskirk,

Leave was granted to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to be hereafter appointed, to bring in a bill to authorise justices of the peace to issue attachments in certain cases.

And to bring in a bill to amend the act of 1723, chapter 8, so as to authorise the clerks of the several County Courts of this state to approve injunction bonds to stay proceedings at law.

On motion of Mr. Handy, of Somerset,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Handy, Fleming, Langford and Rider, to bring in a bill authorising the commissioners for Somerset county, to appoint a collector of the county levy separately from the collector of the direct tax.

On motion of Mr. Lecompte, of Carroll,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Lecompte, of Carroll, Brown, Powder and Shaw, to bring in a bill to elect the commissioners of Carroll county by the people and for other purposes.

On motion of Mr. Lecompte, of Carroll,

Ordered, That a committee of five be appointed by the chair to take into consideration the propriety of asking of the General Government to refund the sum of \$72,000 with interest, given by the State of Maryland to the General Government in the year 1790—with leave to report by resolution or otherwise.
