

Amendments proposed:

In the first line of the first section, after the word "late" insert the word "collector."

After the word "Allegany" in the second line of the first section, insert the word "county."

Which were read and assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

Mr. Hammond, chairman of the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to which was referred the bill from the Senate entitled, an act to make valid a certain deed of mortgage therein mentioned, reported the same without amendment;

Which was read the second time by special order, passed and returned to the Senate.

Mr. Hammond presented the memorial of William S. Harrison and others, asking that a lien law be enacted for Howard District;

Read and referred to Messrs. Hammond, Clarke, Dorsey, Murray and Owens.

Mr. Powder reported a bill entitled, an act for the appointment of commissioners to designate a place of election in the fourth election district of Carroll county;

Mr. Hopkins reported a bill entitled, a further supplement to the act of 1835, chapter 201, so far as the same relates to Harford county;

Severally read the first and by special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Randall, chairman of the committee on Military Pensions and Revolutionary Claims, submitted the following resolutions:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to Ann C. Foreman, of Baltimore city, or to her order, during life, in quarter yearly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, in consideration of the services rendered by her husband during the war of the revolution.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to Mary Walker, of Frederick county, or to her order, during life, in quarter yearly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, in consideration of the services rendered by her husband during the revolutionary war.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby authorised and required, to pay to Elizabeth Colegate, of the city of Baltimore, or to her order, during life, in quarter yearly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a lieutenant, in consideration of the services rendered by her husband John Colegate, during the war of the revolution;

Which were severally read the first, and by special order the second time, assented to and sent to the Senate.
