Which was read and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

Mr. Lackland, from the select committee, to which was referred the bill from the Senate entitled, an act to authorize the commissioners of Cecil county, to levy a sum of money for paying a balance due Levi Tyson, jr., James McCauley and Benjamin Miller, reported the same without amendment;

Read the second time by special order, passed and returned to

the Senate.

Mr. Simpers reported a bill entitled, an act to authorize the measuring of cord-wood in the village of North East, and on the shores of North East river, in Cecil county;

Read the first and by special order the second time, passed and

sent to the senate.

On motion of Mr. Lynch,

Leave was granted to the committee on Corporations to bring in a bill to amend the third section of an act passed December session 1841, entitled, a further supplement to an act passed at December session 1831, chapter 323.

The House then took up the following bills and resolutions,

entitled to a second reading:

The bill entitled, a further supplement to the act authorising the appointment of inspectors and wood corders, and to regulate the cording of fire wood brought to the city of Baltimore;

On motion of Mr. Morsell,

Ordered, That the said bill be laid on the table.

The bill entitled, an act authorising gates to be kept on the public roads in Talbot county, except those roads that the United States mail passes over;

Read the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

The resolution submitted by Mr. Buskirk, authorising the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company to dispose of certain lands therein mentioned;

On motion of Mr. Sutton,

Ordered, That the same be laid on the table.

Also, the resolution in favor of Captain William Small;

Read the second time.

On motion of Mr. Risteau,

The following amendment to the said resolution was read and assented to:

"Provided, the same are in the Armory."

The question then recurred on assenting to the said resolution; And on being put, it was determined in the negative.

On motion of Mr. Hammond,

Ordered, That the communication of the President of the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company, in answer to a letter received by him from the chairman of the committee on Ways and Means, covering an order of the House of the 5th instant, in relation to the three millions of the State bonds, issued under the right million loan of 1835, be printed.
