Mr. Tuck reported a bill entitled, an act to repeal the third section of the act entitled, an act to make public a road in Prince George's county.

Severally read the first and by special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

Read the first and by special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

The House then took up the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Equitable Life Insurance Society of Baltimore ;

Read the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Risteau,

Ordered, That every member of this House report to the committee of Claims every day he has been absent, and to make such report at the time of his return to the seat of government.

The House then took up the following bills, entitled to a second reading :

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the German Tailors Beneficial Society of the city of Baltimore.

And the bill entitled, an act to provide for the extension of the charter of the Fredericktown Savings Institution ;

Severally read the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

The House then took up the resolution in favor of John McCollum, captain of the Westminster Guards ;

Read the second time.

On motion of Mr. Sutton,

The following was added to the said resolution : "Provided they are in the Armory."

The question then recurred on assenting to the said resolution as amended,

And on being put, it was assented to and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Worthington,

The House took up the order submitted by him on the 19th instant, to appoint a committee of three to inquire and examine into the condition of the tobacco warehouses in Baltimore city,
